I hope you had a blessed Christmas and fun-filled break. I can't believe we are almost halfway through our school year and beginning 2025! Our new memory verse for this month will be "Be kind to one another." Ephesians 4:32.

We will be starting our "Your off to great places with reading" program this month. It will continue through February 3th.

Pre-K – Mrs. Dahl

Welcome back, I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas break! As we settle back into our class routine, we will be reviewing the vowels and consonants we have learned so far and then move on to new ones. I am pleased with the children's progress. Our next few letters are Dd, Gg and Rr. I appreciate your cooperation and dedication in helping your child with their memory verses and taking the time to listen to your child read blends and words at home. Reviewing the blend ladders with your child will greatly

help them on the journey to reading. Soon we will begin learning sight words. Put simply, these are words that cannot be sounded out phonetically and must be memorized. They are words used frequently, like the word, "the". We are counting to number 30 and your child should recognize numbers 0-10. Again, I ask that your child comes to school with a WARM coat as we will be going outside for some of our recesses, weather permitting. A few of the students have been cold at recess because they did not have a warm enough coat. Our new memory verse is "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me", Philippians 4:13.

We have almost made it halfway through our school year already. Time is passing so quickly. It is such a joy to get together to play and learn with our class each day. The Lord is blessing our time!
