### Preschool – Miss Bleeker

October has been a lot of fun! We have had fun this past month learning the letters A-H and numbers 1-8.

We will be continuing our study of creation along with learning about our five senses, goodness, and thankfulness this month.

### Kindergarten - Mrs. Kimzey

Another month completed! I hope everyone had fun visiting Three Mile Farm on our field trip. It was so much fun to watch everyone explore with their families and find all the exciting things Ms. Scott had prepared for us. This next month students will be writing their names on their own papers as we have now gone over most of the alphabet: learning their sounds, names (capital and little), and how to write them. We have also been working on our blends, which consists of a consonant followed by a soft vowel sound (i.e. ta, te, ti, to, tu: for all consonant cards that have been sent home). This is the first step to reading. Many are eager to add a 3 rd letter and start creating words (i.e. ta-n, tan, lo-t, lot, etc). Please help your child practice their blends at home. In January, we will be starting our reading groups, so be looking forward to that!

### 1st Grade - Miss Nichole

Our year continues to be fun, exciting, and enjoyable for my students and me. My favorite part of the week is getting to play with them. We have recently started learning about our country's history and in bible we have been learning how and why we should study God's word.

In math, we have continued working on our addition and subtraction facts. We have also started working on story problems in class. Please continue to work on addition and subtraction facts at home. A great time to practice is in the car. I appreciate all the parents who have given time to my students to help them thrive! I really appreciate you and all the extra help.
